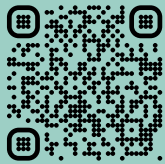

THANK A NURSE

Nurses are the backbone of patient care, often going above and beyond to provide comfort and support. Their tireless dedication, empathy, and expertise not only aid in healing, but also significantly enhance the overall patient experience. By recognizing their contributions, we foster a culture of appreciation that uplifts both healthcare professionals and the patients they assist.

The purpose of the Thank-A-Nurse program is to reward nurses who are employed at Ivinson Memorial Hospital for their exceptional work fulfilling the mission of Ivinson Memorial Hospital. This program was established by an anonymous donor who understands personally the value of IMH caregivers, and recognizes IMH nurses as exceptional people doing exceptional work. Each quarter, an IMH nurse is recognized as the DAISY Award recipient through the IMH Administration. The funds generously donated are used to recognize these nurses. The total gifted as an endowment in this fund is now at \$16,900 thanks to our thoughtful donor.

PATIENT ASSISTANCE FUND

The Patient Assistance Fund plays a crucial role in supporting patients by providing funds for gas, transportation, housing, and prescription medications. The fund helps eliminate barriers that might prevent individuals from receiving treatment. During this campaign, over \$3,000 has been raised by 31 IMH employees.

Part of this campaign includes a fun quarterly activity called “Fun Top Fridays.” IMH employees can wear their Patient Assistance Supporting shirt as a fun top, or any other fun top on these days if they donate \$5. Clinical staff is welcomed to wear fun scrub tops. These days have helped spread moral around the hospital and encouraged more employees to donate to the campaign.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The Emergency Department at IMH supports patients from Albany County and beyond, including the Saratoga Valley in southern Carbon County and Jackson County in Colorado. The doctors and staff at IMH provide expert care for those who come in due to illness, car accidents, sports injuries, or sudden medical emergencies. While the Emergency Services Facility was originally designed to accommodate 8,000 visits yearly, a growing population and increased need within the community has increased visits to the Emergency Department to well over 12,000 annually. With this renovation, the Emergency Services Facility will be prepared to handle up to 15,000 visits per year. The progress made over the year has been tremendous. The first phase of the renovation included preparing the inside of the Facility for the renovation, building a new ambulance bay, moving the nurse's station and physician's office spaces, and creating a new waiting area. The second phase of the renovation will increase the number of treatment rooms from eight to thirteen, and update the full trauma rooms before completing exterior work and finalizing the project. Over 3,000 square feet will be added to the Emergency Services Facility by the end of the project.

PATIENT IMPACT

On January 5, 2023, Mark Mader woke up in Ivinson's Emergency Department after being resuscitated from a heart attack. That morning he had believed his chest and back pain was from recent activity, but he quickly realized something was wrong and rushed to the ER. Within minutes of his arrival, Mark's heart stopped, but the emergency team, led by Dr. Anna Schubert, acted swiftly, using CPR and defibrillation to save his life. Diagnosed with a severe heart attack (STEMI), Mark was transferred by helicopter to Cheyenne Regional Medical Center, where he received surgery and two stents.



Now fully recovered, Mark reflects on how the immediate the medical intervention saved him. He credits his recovery to the quick actions of the ER team and his participation in Ivinson's cardiac rehab program. Grateful for the care he received, Mark penned a letter of thanks to the emergency staff and made a donation, a reminder of the life-saving work they do every day.

CITY OF LARAMIE / ALBANY COUNTY COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP FUNDING

We received a grant through Community Partnership Funding from the City of Laramie in the generous amount of \$5,609. The Community Partner funds were matched dollar-for-dollar by the Challenge Grant offered by John Evans. This donation helped to purchase a General Device CAREpoint 3 Workstation, which connects the EMS and Emergency Department teams improve communication and provide as seamless service patient care as possible. This immediate need purchase has helped improve communication and patient care.

SUPPORT AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

On June 26, 2024, the IMHF held a community event on the west side of the hospital to showcase the Foundation, and to encourage donations to the Capital Campaign benefitting the Emergency Services and Renovation Project. Many community members and employees were able to attend. Comfort Kitchen's food truck catered this event along with Little Snowy's Snow Cones. Baby therapy goats were brought to the event and walked around the first floor of the hospital. There was also a bouncy house, yard games, and The Wendy Woo Band. This event brought awareness of the project to the community and secured additional donations for the Emergency Services Facility Project.





Capital Campaign

VISIONARY PHILANTHROPIST



Iverson Memorial Hospital broke ground on the Emergency Services and Renovation Project in May of 2023. Prior to the ground breaking, the IMH Foundation Board of Directors committed to fundraising \$4 million over four to five years in order to support the \$14 million total renovation costs. This marked the largest campaign in the IMH Foundation's 40 year history. The campaign started strong with donations made at the Foundation's numerous fundraising events, and 100% participation in donations from all IMH Board members, IMH Trustees, and all IMH Foundation Board members, some who gifted at the Major Donor giving level. What took the campaign to the next level, were donations from

Leadership Level donors. These gifts included over \$300,000 from Mr. Bill Werner, allocated capital construction gifts previously gifted through the Etchepare Estate, and a very generous gift from Mr. John Evans. In June 2023, Mr. Evans offered the Foundation a \$5 million “Challenge Grant” in match money to be used to incentivize giving in the Laramie community. The Foundation raised over \$1 million in under a year using the matching funds to attract donors to support the project. Over the last year, Mr. Evans was presented with the option to consider gifting the full amount to the Foundation, and in return he would receive the opportunity to name the new Emergency Service Facility. Mr. Evans accepted this opportunity and the receipt of his donation helped the campaign reach over \$7 million raised to support the Emergency Services Facility and Renovation Project. John chose to name the new Emergency Department in honor of his late wife, and the Janey Hampton Emergency Services Facility is scheduled to be completed by summer of 2025.

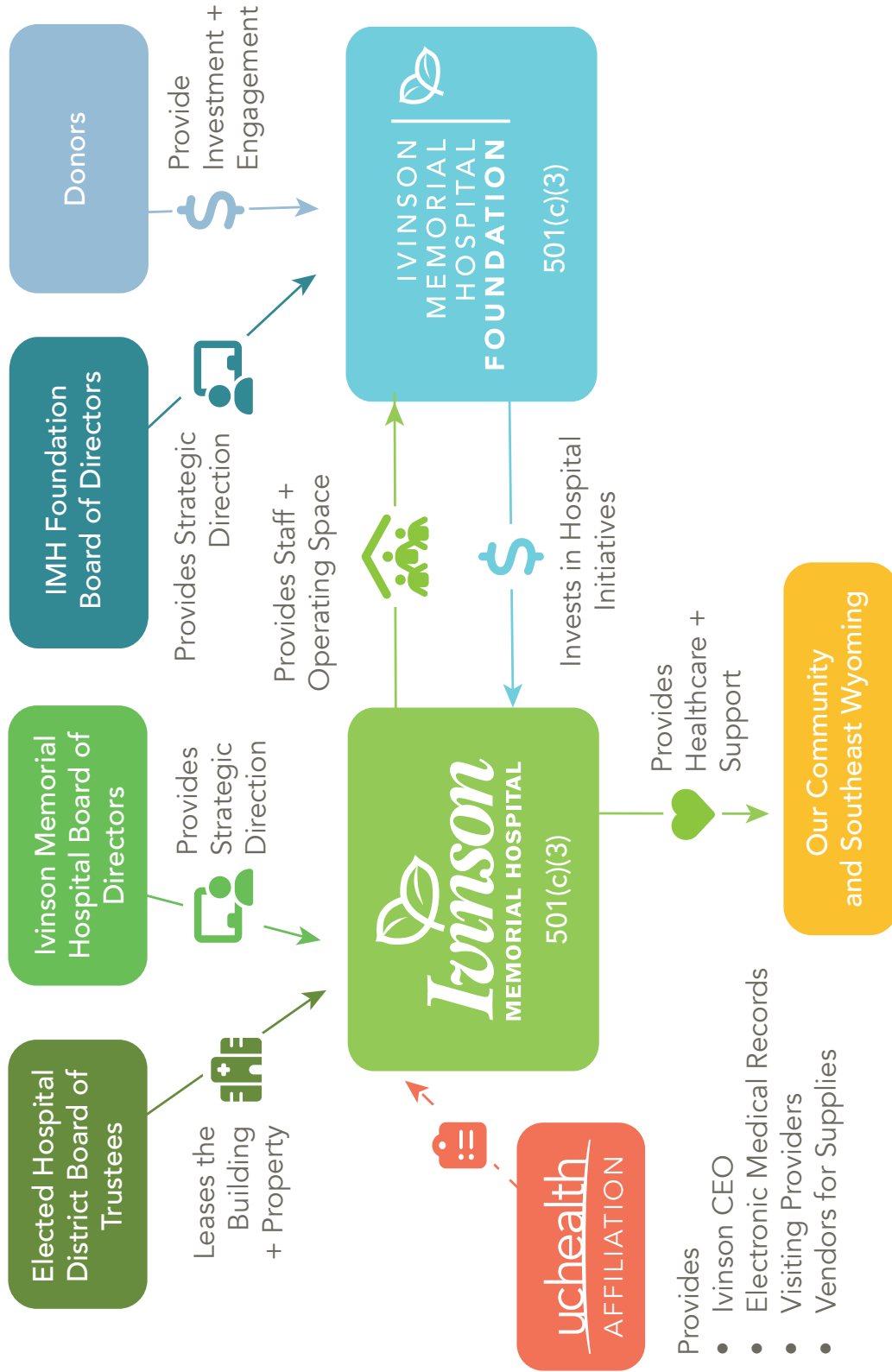
